A Reflection

God the Word became flesh, that through His Incarnation our flesh might attain to union with God the Word. And lest we should think that this incarnate Word was some other than the Word of God, or that His flesh was of a body different from ours, He dwelt among us that by His dwelling He might be known as the in dwelling God, and, by His dwelling among us, known as god incarnate in no other flesh than our own, and moreover, though He had condescended to take our flesh, not destitute of His own attributes; for He, the only-begotten of the Father, full of grace and truth, is fully possessed of His own attributes and truly endowed with ours.

He by Whom man was made had nothing to gain by becoming Man; it was our gain that God was incarnate and dwelt among us, making all flesh His home by taking upon Him the flesh of One. We were raised because He was lowered; shame to Him was glory to us. He, being God, made flesh His residence, and we in return are lifted anew from the flesh to God.

There is no space where God is not; space does not exist apart from Him. He is in heaven, in hell, beyond the seas; dwelling in all things and enveloping all. Thus He embraces, and is embraced by, the universe, confined to no part of it but pervading all.

FIRST READING

A reading from the First Book of Samuel.

Now the boy Samuel was ministering to the Lord under Eli. The word of the Lord was rare in those days; visions were not widespread. In the coming weeks we shall give thanks for Archbishop Melissa's ministry amongst us these past seven years, and pray for Fr. John as he takes up his new responsibilities. We look forward to his first Episcopal Visitation to St. James' when his calendar, and the pandemic, permit.

It is with deep sadness, together with much thanksgiving, that we announce the death on Wednesday of Brian Rocksborough-Smith, ODNW, a lifelong member of St. James' and former Rector's Warden. Brian was diagnosed with advanced cancer just after Christmas. We extend our love, sympathy and prayers to Jennifer, Ian and Michael, and pray that Brian may rest in peace and rise in glory. The funeral will be private. A larger gathering will be held at a later date when Provincial Health Orders permit.

REFUGEE CO-SPONSORSHIP

St. James' has a history of supporting refugees, not least through the passion and commitment of the late John Conway. The parish has received a request from the Diocesan Refugee Unit to consider being Co-Sponsor to two Eritrean refugees currently in Israel. This would entail supporting the Constituent Group, in this case family members resident in Canada, which already has the necessary funds in hand. So it is not primarily financial support/fund-raising, but being a link which permits the Group to apply under the umbrella of the Diocese. There may be opportunities for parishioners to support the Group in practical ways too, for example, greeting at the airport, English tutoring.
