

FIRST READING

A reading from the Book of Jeremiah.

Woe to the shepherds who destroy and scatter the sheep of my pasture! says the Lord. SECOND READING

A reading from the Letter of Paul to the Ephesians.

So then, remember that at one time you Gentiles by birth, called “the uncircumcision” by those who are called “the circumcision”—a physical circumcision made in the flesh by human hands—remember that you were at that time without Christ, being aliens from the commonwealth of Israel, and strangers to the covenants of promise, having no hope and without God in the world. But now in Christ Jesus you who once were far off have been brought near by the blood of Christ. For he is our peace; in his flesh he has made both groups into one and has broken down the dividing wall, that is, the hostility between us. He has abolished the law with its commandments and ordinances, so that he might create in himself one new humanity in place of the two, thus making peace, and might reconcile both groups to God in one body through the cross, thus putting to death that hostility through it. So he came and proclaimed peace to you who were far off and peace to those who were near; for through him both of us have access in one Spirit to the Father. So then you are no longer strangers and aliens, but you are citizens with the saints and also members of the household of God, built upon the foundation of the apostles and prophets, with Christ Jesus himself as the cornerstone. In him the whole structure is joined together and grows into a holy temple in the Lord; in whom you also are built together spiritually into a dwelling-place for God.

Clergy Notes

“And then she hears her name, she hears Love say
The Word that turns her night, and ours, to Day.”

These verses come from the Malcolm Guite sonnet “Easter Dawn”, selected for Reflection this week. The sonnet muses on the encounter between Mary Magdalene (Feast Day July 22) and the Risen Christ on the first Easter morning, given to us in St. John’s Gospel (20.11-18).

That encounter, and the transformation it brings, always moves me: it brings home so vividly the significance of being named, being recognised, being known by our name. It highlights too the destructive impact of being unknown, of having our name ignored, mispronounced or misspelt; of it being changed, taken away, or even replaced by a number, as happened in the holocaust death-camps and at some residential schools, for example. It is an element of the current anguish over the children’s unmarked graves.

Mary Magdalene at the tomb is desolate and in despair. Where is the body of the Lord whom she loves? She asks the one she guesses is the Gardener, “Tell me where you have laid him, and I will take him away.” It is only when he says, “Mary!” that she realises this is Jesus. Her grief is transported into joy.

So let us be careful to use others’ names with reverence, care and respect. And in the midst of life’s trials and tribulations, and in our last hour, may we hear the Risen Lord calling each of us by name, so transforming our sorrow, as Mary Magdalene’s, into the deepest joy.
