# A Reflection

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God works on both sides of the street.

The despairing ones do not see how a newness can come, how evil can be overcome, or how futures can arise from the totalitarian present. This awesome programmatic statement affirms that something is “on the move” in the darkness that even the lord of darkness does not discern. It is strange that neither Egypt nor Israel understands the movement of the darkness! Israel is no more privy to God’s freedom than Egypt is. And when Israel yearns to know too much about that freedom, Israel easily plays the role of Egypt. In any case, this narrative knows that the darkness may be trusted to God as it surely cannot be trusted to Pharaoh. That is energizing because the alternative community dares to affirm how it will turn out. It knows what Pharaoh does not know. It knows, but it does not understand. It knows because it has submitted, and that submission began when the cry was cried toward the free one. There is new energy in finding one who can be trusted with the darkness and who can be trusted to be more powerful than the one who ostensibly rules the light.

The God who will decide is not the comfortable god of the empire, so fat and well fed as to be neutral and inattentive. Rather, it is the God who is alert to the realities, who does not flinch from taking sides, who sits in the divine council on the edge of his seat and is attentive to his special interests. It is the way of the unifying gods of the empire not to take sides and, by being tolerant, to cast eternal votes for the way things are.

# Clergy Notes

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I had a very different topic planned this week, but in light of the terrible news coming out of Israel and Gaza, I could not in good conscience write about anything else. It can be tempting to keep silent in situations like this; situations which are complex and charged with emotion.

However, those affected are real human people, Israeli and Palestinian, with families and friends, hopes and dreams; human beings made in the image of God. It is difficult not to feel helpless. We may not understand where God is in all of it, but we may be *very* sure that God is paying attention.

Indiscriminate violence against innocents to achieve any political goal is unacceptable. We have an obligation to lift our voices against terrorism, and a particular obligation to our Jewish neighbours and friends in this part of the world to love and support them as they grieve losses unimaginable. It is dangerous to ignore the fact that here as elsewhere, anti-Jewish rhetoric has damaged and still continues to damage lives and families. It is not about assigning blame or taking sides; it is about following Jesus' command to love one another. It is about being human together.

Pray for all those who have lost loved ones. Pray for peace and an end to violence. But also, love one another. Do not look away from the suffering faces of those whom God is watching intently. See them as the beloved children of God they are; pray for them; love them. It is the only way hatred can ever be extinguished, here on earth.
